Pratt Fall 2020 Student Survey

The purpose of this brief survey was to find out about students' online and/or hybrid learning experiences during the Fall 2020 semester.

Pratt Fall 2020 Course Evaluations

The course evaluation is used as the process of gathering information about the impact of learning and of teaching practice on student learning.

We compared results from:

- Students of faculty who completed the RTO
- Students of faculty who did not complete the RTO

Student Survey - Overview of results

Students whose faculty completed the RTO were **more satisfied with their online learning**, rated their **professors more positively** as competent online teachers, reported **stronger connection with their peers**, and felt that their professors were better **supporting their overall wellbeing** - compared students from the rest of Pratt faculty.

RTO Impact on Student Experiences

We expected differences between students whose faculty completed the RTO compared students from the rest of Pratt faculty for the following questions:

Expected higher/more frequent responses:

- What is your experience taking courses this semester thus far?
- My professors understood how to teach well online
- My professors supported my learning and well-being
- I was able to connect with my classmates online
- I am better able to balance my learning with my other responsibilities

Expected lower/less frequent responses:

- My professors have not found effective ways to support my learning online
- I am not clear on what I am supposed to do in my courses

Expected more frequency of positive words:

- Three words that describe your overall learning experience

Higher Overall Online Learning Experience

Students of RTO faculty: 29% Better than Expected; 15% Worse than expected
Students of other faculty: 21% Better than Expected; 23% Worse than expected









Course Evaluations - Overview of results

Students whose faculty completed the RTO rated their instructor as having promoted a **constructive classroom climate**, **stimulated their interest** in learning, and **provided feedback** in a timely manner. Students of RTO faculty also rated their courses as having improved their **understanding of the subject matter, problem solving skills, effective communication skills and research skills** compared students from the rest of Pratt faculty.

RTO Impact on Student Learning

Pratt Fall 2020 Course Evaluations

We expected differences between students whose faculty completed the RTO compared students from the rest of Pratt faculty for the following questions:

- The instructor promoted a constructive classroom climate
- The instructor was available outside of class
- The instructor made the goal of the course clear
- The instructor stimulated my interest
- The instructor provided feedback in a timely manner
- The instructor utilized the class time well
- The quality of assigned work was appropriate to goals of the course


There were statistically significant differences in all the above questions

All that and more...


We found statistically significant differences in 20 categories, including those that pertain to student learning.

Including:

- The course improved my **understanding of the subject matter**
- The course helped me **improve my problem solving skills**
- I learned to **communicate more effectively** by taking this course
- This course improved my **ability to work well with others**
- The course improved **my ability to do research** to complete course requirements
- etc.



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
