



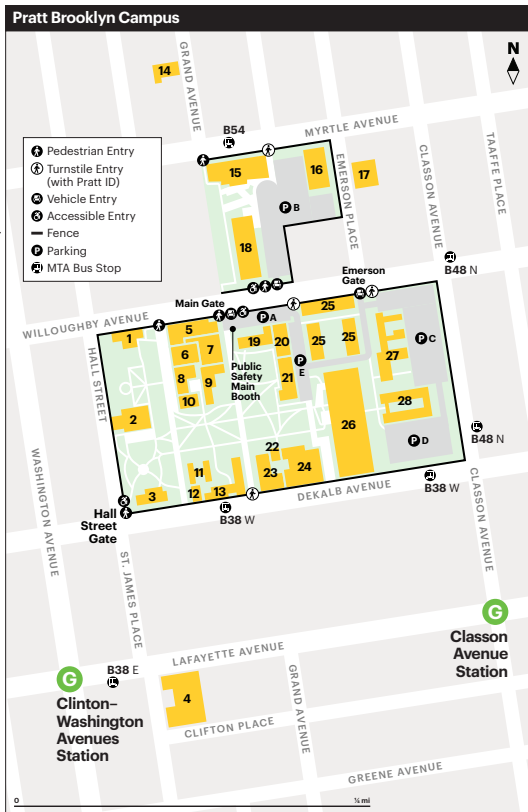
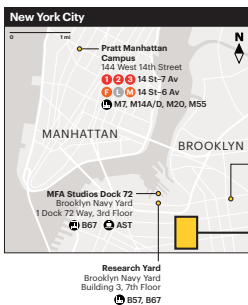

- Instructions and support relating to online class roster. We work with Faculty to identify and drop students that are on the class roster that have not shown up to class. provision of data to academic and administrative departments and federal and state compliance report.

- Enrollment and graduation verifications.
- Oversee the completion of degree requirements.
- Certify degree requirements for all students and issue diplomas.



# Office of Undergraduate Advising

We are a staff of thirteen professional advisors, and each undergraduate student is assigned an advisor based on their major.

What we do:

- Meet with students at least twice a year to inform them of their course requirements for graduation and to track their academic progress
- Engage in holistic advising in which the advisor focuses on the whole student. We are to develop a rapport with the student through which students are encouraged and guided on how to take responsibility for their progress and success.
- Act as liaisons, when necessary, between students and campus offices such as the office of the Registrar, Student Success, Learning Access Center, OIA, Health, Counseling, HEOP, etc.
- Keep abreast of changes in departments and assist in disseminating this information to the students. Advisors meet with the chairpersons of the department(s) they advise at least twice a year and are encouraged to participate in the department sponsored student events.
- Inform students of Pratt academic policies and procedures.
- Administer Academic probation and dismissal actions twice yearly and follow up with students who are at-risk.
- Update student degree audits regularly so that all graduation requirements are clear.
- Track academic flags, send outreach messages related to academic flags, and submit referrals through Starfish to support offices.

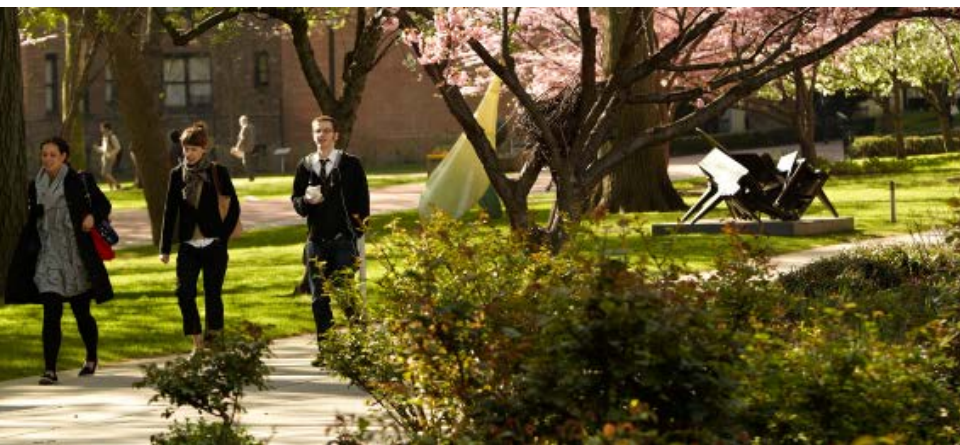

### What we do not do:

- Act as a tutor, therapist or parent— Advisors are experienced guides, and are here to help students engage with the appropriate resource. We expect students to be responsible for regularly checking and responding to our emails, and be aware of important deadlines listed in the academic calendar. Ultimately, students are to take responsibility for their education.
- Advise students to take specific sections of classes with a particular faculty member— We empower students to identify their interests, and help them make the best decisions regarding class selection to meet their academic goals. We encourage them to discuss with chairs, and faculty when they need industry specific guidance regarding section selection.
- Professional planning and advising—We encourage them to reach out to Chairs, faculty, and Center for Career Professional Development regarding industry knowledge and professional practices.
- Counseling—We are not trained as counselors. We refer students with emotional or mental concerns to the Counseling, Health, or Learning/ Access Centers.

### How we help faculty

- Answer questions about Pratt policies and procedures.
- Share course descriptions with the undergraduate student body.
- Track academic flags submitted by faculty in Starfish. We will be a resource when a student is struggling academically.
- Offer insight into registration processes.

# Learning/Access Center (L/AC)

The Learning/Access Center (L/AC) facilitates full access for Pratt students with disabilities so they can freely and actively participate in all facets of Pratt life. The L/AC collaborates to provide Institute-wide advisement and consultation on disability-related matters (including legal compliance and universal design) and provides individual services and tools to facilitate diverse learning styles and accommodations in a sustainable, inclusive manner.

Current and prospective Pratt students who identify as having disabilities, including learning disorders, ADHD, psychological/psychiatric conditions, chronic illnesses, physical/mobility conditions, blindness, low vision and hearing loss, as well as temporary disabilities can register with the L/AC to determine and receive reasonable accommodations for the classroom, housing, and other campus settings. The L/AC also arranges elevator access, assistive technology, software, and materials in alternative formats. L/AC staff assist students in connecting with helpful Institute resources, advocate for students in implementing accommodations, and collaborate with campus department administrators regarding specific student needs. The L/AC also houses the Veteran Resource Center and works with the Accessibility Committee to advance accessibility at Pratt.

The L/AC is open for virtual and in-person meetings, Monday-Friday, 9am to 5pm. Additional virtual hours are also available. Please contact L/AC by email or phone for an appointment.

## Benefit to Faculty

- If a student experiences an injury that affects mobility, the L/AC will work with the registrar for classroom relocation to an accessible space.
- The L/AC notifies faculty about students with disabilities who receive classroom accommodations via an email notification. Receipt of the email is considered the legal notification to provide accommodations, and indicates that the student has provided permission for the professor and L/AC to speak. The L/AC works with students and faculty as needed to implement the approved accommodations.
- Faculty can refer students who have disclosed disabilities (including mental health conditions) via Starfish or by connecting them with L/AC staff. Faculty can confer with L/AC staff about student concerns and discuss strategies for accommodation implementation.
- Staff are available to give presentations at departmental, faculty, or other meetings, on a wide range of topics related to the accommodation of students at Pratt.

## Benefit to Students

- Students with disabilities can register with L/AC to determine and receive reasonable accommodations for classroom, housing, and other campus settings.
  - Students who register with the L/AC do not need to provide documentation and explanations to professors each time they need an accommodation; students can select professor notification to protect their privacy and simplify accommodation implementation.
  - If appropriate, the L/AC can arrange for non-classroom accommodations such as priority registration or reduced course load.
- The L/AC also houses the Veteran Resource Center, which assists veterans and military-affiliated students with connections to resources appropriate to veteran's specific needs, including accommodations if appropriate.

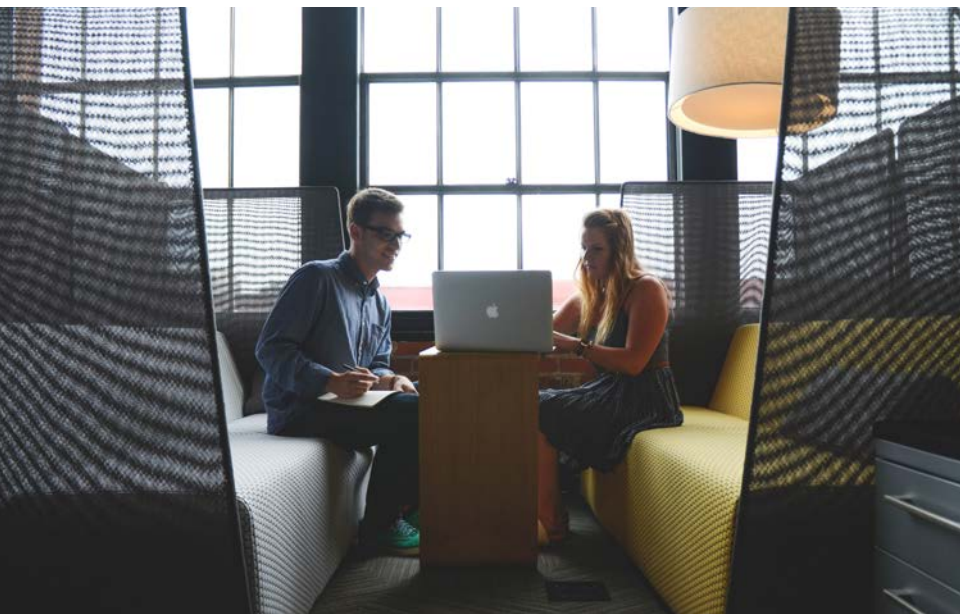

### Benefit to Faculty and Students

- The Office of Institutional Equity and Title IX addresses equity concerns across the Institute.
- The protections and rights under Pratt's Title IX, Nondiscrimination, and Anti-Harassment Policy apply to the entire Pratt community.
- Faculty and students are protected from retaliation for reporting discrimination or harassment or participating in the Institute's resolution process.
- Faculty and students impacted by discrimination, harassment, or sexual misconduct have the right to receive supportive measures from Pratt at any time. Supportive measures are non-disciplinary and non-punitive individualized services provided by Pratt, free of charge, to individuals to restore or preserve equal access to Pratt's education program or activity without unreasonably burdening involved parties.
- To ensure all community members impacted by discrimination, harassment, and sexual misconduct are supported, Pratt requires all employees (including faculty members) to report knowledge of these incidents impacting other community members to the Title IX Coordinator. Confidential employees are exempt from this reporting requirement, and harmed parties (faculty or students) are never required to report or self-disclose incidents (but are encouraged to do so).
- Typically those impacted by discrimination, harassment, and sexual misconduct are not required to meet with the Title IX Coordinator or participate in any of Pratt's resolution processes.

The mission of the Pratt Institute Department of Campus Safety is to ensure a safe and secure campus that is welcoming and inclusive. The Department assists the Institute in maintaining and fostering a student centered, learning-focused, and diverse campus where community members and visitors can feel safe. The Department of Campus Safety provides 24-hour protection of the campus and maintains contact with the local police department (88th Precinct Brooklyn and 6th Precinct Manhattan). Police visit the campus at the request of the Department of campus Public Safety for the purposes of investigating crimes.
